Some Things To Consider Before Rehoming



Commitment

Getting a cat settled in a new home takes love, time and patience.



Holidays

Even though they are independent animals, when you go away, cats still need looking after.



Comfort

Cats need a comfortable environment to live in, so ensure they've got everything they need.



Time

Cats need to be cared for every single day – not just when you feel like it or have time.



Money

Food, vets bills and equipment can be expensive over time, so be prepared for this during the life of your animal.

Responsibility

Ensure your cat is neutered as this will not only prevent unwanted kittens, but can also help prevent illness and some unwanted behaviour.

How It Works



Get in touch with your local branch or animal centre to arrange a visit.



The branch or animal centre will help you fill in the right forms and give you the information you need to get started.



You will be matched with the right cat and have the opportunity to meet and reserve him or her.



We will visit your home to make sure it's suitable for your new companion.



After a few final checks and paperwork you can take your new cat home.



We usually arrange another home visit, just to make sure you're getting on together.
