Some Things To Consider Before Rehoming



Commitment

Getting a dog settled in a new home takes love, time and patience.



Exercise

Dogs need regular exercise to stay happy and healthy.



Comfort

Dogs need a comfortable environment with somewhere quiet to rest.



Time

Dogs need your companionship and care every single day.



Money

Food, vets bills and equipment can be expensive over time, so be prepared for this during the life of your animal.



Responsibility

Be responsible, keep your dog on a lead when necessary and clear up mess.

How It Works



Get in touch with your local branch or animal centre to arrange a visit.



The branch or animal centre will help you fill in the right forms and give you the information you need to get started.



You will be matched with the right dog and have the opportunity to meet and reserve him or her.



We will visit your home to make sure it's suitable for your new companion.



After a few final checks and paperwork you can take your new dog home.



We usually arrange another home visit, just to make sure you're getting on together.
